


More often than not, a new year is determinied by the path of a planet or the ticking of a clock or the turning

It's been a crazy few weeks, not counting the holidays! First of all, some news! If you haven't already heard, the sale is final! The papers were signed, Friday afternoon, January 11th! And the money's in the bank. (FYI, the council is in the process of determining where to "invest" the receipts from the sale. We'll let you know the details as they're available) Then, Sunday



morning, January 27th, Midland Chin Immanuel and Midland Lutheran traded places! So now, our "new" worship space is the "old" fellowship hall. 




