
# #SOWCT

Today's day forty-six in the wilderness! That's seven Sundays (including Palm Sunday and Easter), three Lenten devotions, one Maundy Thursday, one Good Friday, and three evening studies! But who's counting, right! Anyway, according to the president, the federal government's social distancing

guidelines expire, today, as does Texas' stay-at-home order. The state will, now, begin to reopen . And right about now, you're, probably, asking yourself that good Lutheran question ... What does this mean?

First of all, contrary to the weekly appearances on Facebook, we're, still, in the fellowship hall at Midland Chin Immanuel Church! I've been out and about, Sunday mornings, for a couple, three, reasons. First, I wanted to find a way to show that "church" isn't a place, it's a people! We're the church – not just behind colored glass – but at kitchen tables and patios and backyards and parks, even cemeteries. Second, one of the lessons we've needed to learn, for a while now, is how to be church out in the open! We know what to do and how to do it when no one's watching. But it's different when we're visible, vulnerable. People driving by! Walking past! Flying kites! Playing catch!

But now, here in Texas, it's business-as-usual ... kinda. Churches and other religious houses of worship are allowed to meet in-person. Social distancing is encouraged and people who are considered at-risk should use online services when possible. Attendees should keep at least two seats or 6-feet of separation between them. People of the same household can sit beside each other, with two empty seats on each side. However ....

The congregationCouncil has decided to keep doing things the way we've been doing them, for the past couple months. Most of us are in the "at risk" category! And getting back together too soon isn't

worth the risk. We figured we'd opt for that better part of valor! Take our time. Wait and see. That, by the way, is the advice from the Synod, as well.

So, Sunday morning "worship" will continue to be livestreamed on Facebook, 10:30am. We'll livestream the "Morning Blessing" from the *Small Catechism*, sunrise, every Tuesday and Thursday. And each Wednesday at 7:00, the pmStudy will be livestreamed on Facebook, as well. Of course, there will be the usual posts ...

For those of us not online, we'll continue sharing sermons and devotions via snailMail! And there's always the phone! Take the time to call each other! Check out how things are going. And if you haven't heard from anyone, lately, pick up the phone and call yourself! Funny thing how it goes both ways!

Now, a few things that might be able to change ... a few people could join us for worship on Sunday mornings! Bring a lawn chair! Enjoy the Word! The world! Some might want to attend the pmStudy in the fellowshipHall, now and then! And we might, even, have a little something on the Patio, every so often, to see each other along the way! Times and places when and where we can "socialize" ... responsibly! Let me know what you think.

Well, I think that's enough, for now. We'll give it another month and, at the end of May, see what's next! I'll be sure to let you know what that might be! 
#### the DAY of PENTECOST, may 31


