



One of the things our neighbors need is the opportunity to hear and receive gospel! They need to know how much god loves them! How much their lives matter! And that's why we give to a congregation! Not for the building! Not for the budget! We give so that the gospel can be proclaimed and that the good news can be administered! To help us do that, the congregationCouncil has decided to try going digital financially! Here's a letter prepared by Fred Behnken, treasurer of the congregation ...

COVID-19, Social Distancing and Offering Donations

Not knowing the future of on-going social distancing and restrictions on gathering assembly sizes due to the COVID-19 virus, our Congregational Council remains committed to the health and welfare of each of you. We will continue to suspend in-person worship and midweek class gatherings until such time as medical experts relax restraints on assembly and social distancing. If we follow current social distancing guidelines for worship, the distancing would allow about 15 members to gather. Council will continue to meet via Zoom or using FaceBook Messenger. You can catch the worship live via Facebook Live video on Sundays, Tuesday and Thursday sunrise devotions and Wednesday evening classes on our FaceBook. You can also catch up on saved video presentations.

Some of you have found numerous ways to share, serve and comfort your neighbors, friends and strangers by calling, messaging, donating your time and goods to help those in need. This is as it should be.

The May church newsletter alerted you to continue to look for information on alternative means of making donations to our church and its mission in Midland and beyond. Of course, there has always been and continues to be the physical check and envelope delivered by the postal service to the church.

To augment donation checks delivered by the postal service (aka snail mail), we are rolling out an electronic donation program called GivePlus by Vanco after considerable Investigation and trial runs. Using this platform, you have several choices to support the on-going ministries of Midland Lutheran by on-line web, mobile or text donations.

GivePLus offers an exclusive ELCA-wide discounted giving program. There is no up-front cost. Donations may be made on the on-line web, your smart phone or mobile giving, as well as by text app from you cell phone. The service charges transaction fees for the donations based on the type of payment by credit/debit or ACH/echeck draft on your bank account.

Mobil App or Web Pay Donation Fees

are an added charge per each transaction

Debit/Credit card transaction fee * 2.35% + \$0.35/transaction.

AMEXPRESS fee * 3.5% + \$0.35/transaction

ACH/echeck bank draft fee * 0.8 % + \$0.35/transaction

Text Donations are paid by a single Flat \$5/month payment per monthly for all text transactions.

For those with internet access, WebPay is an option. An internet link is set up for donations on our FaceBook page. Soon it will also be on our church web page. The WebGivePlus link will take you to a secure donation page. The first time you can set up an account ID and password. You can then sign on and fill in some additional information about the donation amount to selected accounts and select the donation as a one-time or recurring donation and its frequency. Your donations can be drawn by charging a debit or credit card or by ACH/echeck drawn on your bank account. Any future donations will simply require you going to the website link, logging in and entering the donation amount and frequency. You will receive an email confirmation of your donation and at any time you can see a report of your on-line GivePlus donation frequency and total giving.




